From the Pastor's Desk

I'm thinking about safety today—I have watched the apartment building burning in London, and seen the updates on the shooting of Rep. Scalise and others in



Alexandria. But that is only the latest in so many tragedies (preventable and not) that happen in our world. There are natural disasters, acts of evil, dreaded diseases and birth defects, auto and other accidents, untimely deaths—I could go on.

There are Christians who believe that God protects them from these terrible things. We can, in fact, see that belief reflected in some of our scriptures. For instance, Psalm 4:8: "In peace I will lie down and sleep, for you alone, LORD, make me dwell in safety." Or Proverbs 1:33: "... whoever listens to me will live in safety and be at ease, without fear of harm." These verses reflect the view of the Deuteronomist (a large voice in the Old Testament), which asserts that faithfulness leads to blessing and unfaithfulness leads to curse.

Here is why I don't believe this works in the world we live in. First, unlike some of the "prosperity gospel" preachers, God does *NOT* promise that we who follow Jesus will be heathy, wealthy, and wise. What God *DOES* promise is presence, welcome, love, mercy. God is not an insurance agent. God does not prevent bad things from happening—if that were true, then Jesus would not have died on the cross. In fact, one of the temptations Jesus faced was to jump off the Temple pinnacle and let God's angels save him. He refused to test God in this way.

Friends, we *ARE* safe in God's hands—just not safe from the bad things that assail us and our world. We are able to endure these things because God is with us, and gives us strength and peace. We can count on God's grace and love through whatever we face. God says, "Do not be afraid; I am with you. . . because you are precious in my eyes . . . and I love you."
