From the Pastor's Desk . . .

Dear Friends,

It's interesting to me that both my phone and my Facebook page give me reminders of what is in my past. You know how it goes: A photo pops up of



a little baby, and a caption saying "Your memories of five years ago." And, sure enough, our kindergarten granddaughter of today was just an infant then. Or maybe it's a picture from a vacation several years ago . . . or a special event at church . . . or a pet long gone. Those memories are bittersweet, and they remind me how quickly time passes.

I think those pop-up "memories" are important, though. They remind me of where I have been, and make me feel grateful for what *was*, even as I am in the middle of what *is*.

The Bible is like that. As we read the stories of long, long ago, we remember what God has done for God's people from the beginning. We are reminded of escape from slavery, return from exile, feeding by the lakeshore and in an upper room, forgiveness given from a cross, an empty tomb. Transformation Team

One of the guidelines that R. Wayne Calhoun identified regarding our efforts is to avoid jumping quickly to conclusions or decisions without taking time to reflect on what God wants us to do. Our concerns urge us to quickly declare a solution, but R. Wayne's advice is to step back a bit so that we can gain a sense of God's direction. That is essential. Consequently, we study some recommended books that reveal successful renewal achieved by other church congregations. The first book we have undertaken is *Unbinding the Gospel*, by Martha Grace Reese. The author explains some of the pitfalls of other congregations, and encourages us to pray and thereby to release ourselves to God's wisdom and direction. This is something that most of us are not familiar with. Of course we pray -- but -- we are not experienced in praying in such a way to really open ourselves to God's direction. That openness is very important. Thus, this takes time. And it takes patience. And it takes focused effort. As a team, we are moving toward that kind of unity that will strengthen us as a team and us as our congregation. As Joe Hunnings told the congregation on October 8, we encourage all of the congregation to pray on a daily basis. Do that as we also do it. We all know that prayer is powerful and creative, and we ask your commitment to daily prayer. We are continuing on the path, and your prayers will help light our way.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

October 15, 2017

The Session met on Sunday, October 15, 2017 and the following items were discussed.

Mary Rhodes will be our Commissioner to the Presbytery of the Peaks on November 16, 2017.

Thus far we have received 29 pledges for our 2018 budget. We expect about 20 more pledges in the coming days. We anticipate that we may need to do some trimming of budget allocations as compared with this year's budget.

We are currently below budget in expenses for this time of year and further below budget in income. There is currently about a \$5,000 difference between expenses and income. It is hoped that this will decrease as members continue to pay their pledges.

There will be a Life Line Screening session at Northside this fall. No date has been set.

We will purchase an AED for the church to use in case of cardiac emergency. We will purchase the model recommended by the Rescue Squad.

We continued our discussion of ways to reach out to our community. The Deacons will be working on this as well as Heidi Harper who will be inviting members to help with this effort.

Five members of our congregation and Reverend Linda will participate in a Presbytery of the Peaks Seminar on Church Development and Transformation in Lynchburg on October 25.

Other upcoming events include a visit from Transitional General Presbyter Carl Utley on November 12.

Many Ways to Help the Montgomery County Christmas Store
